Community Foundation Makerspace Grant


The Youth Department is excited to have some new items for the Maker Action Center! What is Maker Action Center (MAC)? It is a place where you make stuff, but many times making is more important than the "stuff" you make. Anyone can follow directions and make something, but it's the *act* of making that is important because that is where the learning happens. Our MAC program is a do-it-yourself makerspace where kids can gather to create, invent and learn. We started the program last year with a few items that we had collected, but longed for some new STEM related materials for our kids here at the library. We applied for a grant from the Community Foundation of Boone County (CFBC) and were awarded \$300 to add some cool additions to our makerspace. The grant has helped us purchase many items including a Code & Go Mouse Robot activity set, a Think & Learn Code-A-Pillar and expansion pack, a Little Bits Gadgets & Gizmos kit, a small weaving loom and some LEGO light-up building bricks. The children are eager to work with anything new that we add to the MAC program and have enjoyed some of our new additions already, especially the robot mouse that the kids can code to find its way through a maze. Thank you CFBC! We are learning and having fun!

REUSE Heart & Sole Shoe Collection

The library will again be a collection site for Boone County Solid Waste Management District's annual shoe collection program. This year, they are accepting ALL types of shoes, even singles and those too worn to pass along. Reusable shoes will be redistributed mainly in the Central Indiana area. Gourd Patch Crafting Sessions in February

In February the Sugar Creek Gourd Patch will be in the library's meeting rooms to finish making/carving gourd lamps and to work on individual projects from 6-8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 7 and 21. The Thorn Tree Gourd Patch will work on similar projects as well as snowmen on Feb. 14 and 28 from 2-4:00 p.m. New participants are welcome to any session. If you call Karen in advance of the meeting, she will see that enough supplies are on hand. Karen needs to cut a replacement bird feeder in February, and the groups plan to make apple gourd bird houses before spring nesting starts. The state gourd show has been in Lebanon for the past five years but on May 4-5 will be at the Fulton County Historical Society Richland Center in Rochester. Hundreds of gourds, fresh, dry, and crafted with multiple techniques, will be available.

Family Game Night

The library will host another Family Game Night from 5-8 on Friday, February 23 in the library's Guinn Room. There will be a variety of dice games (Shut the Box, Roll for It!, Fill or Bust!), tile games (Lanterns, Hive, Qwirkle), and board games (Dream Home, Ticket to Ride, Clue) to play. Staff will be available to teach new games, and several old favorites will be on hand, too. This is a drop-in program, so stop by and play a game (or three)! Book Discussion - The Nightingale

Join the Adult Book Discussion group as they discuss *The Nightingale* by Kristin Hannah. *The Nightingale* tells the stories of two sisters, separated by years and experience, by ideals, passion and circumstance, each embarking on her own dangerous path toward survival, love, and freedom in German-occupied, war-torn France.

Discussions last approximately one hour, and light refreshments are provided. Those who have not finished reading the book are welcome to join the group. The discussion will take place on Monday, February 12 at 1:30 p.m. in the Young Adult room. Copies of the book are still available at the adult circulation desk—please join us!


Friends Board Meeting
