Thank you to everyone who contributed to the 2023 ReUSE Heart & Sole Shoe Drive. The library was able to collect 718 pairs of shoes this year! We beat 2022's record of 384 pairs of shoes! Where do the shoes end up? Those that are in good condition will be donated to people in need. Those that are in not-so-good condition will be recycled. Most important is where the shoes won't end up—in a landfill, where it can take over 200 years for a pair of shoes to decompose! Thanks to Boone County Solid Waste Management District for coordinating this effort each year.

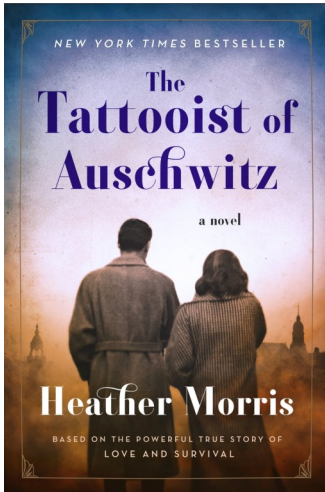


Daylight Saving Time - March 12

Get ready to spring forward! On Sun. March 12, clocks will be move from 2:00 a.m. to 3:00 a.m. We recommend making the change Saturday night before going to bed! Sunrise and sunset will be about one hour later on Mar 12, 2023 than the day before. There will be more light in the evening.

March Book Discussion

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On March 13 at 1:30 the book club will meet in the meeting rooms to discuss *The Tattooist of Auschwitz* by Heather Morris.



In April 1942, Lale Sokolov, a Slovakian Jew, is forcibly transported to the concentration camps at Auschwitz-Birkenau. When his captors discover that he speaks several languages, he is put to work as a *Tätowierer* (the German word for tattooist), tasked with permanently marking his fellow prisoners.

Imprisoned for over two and a half years, Lale witnesses horrific atrocities and barbarism—but also incredible acts of bravery and compassion. Risking his own life, he uses his privileged position to exchange jewels and money from murdered Jews for food to keep his fellow prisoners alive.

One day in July 1942, Lale, prisoner 32407, comforts a trembling young woman waiting in line to have the number 34902 tattooed onto her arm. Her name is Gita, and in that first encounter, Lale vows to somehow survive the camp and marry her.

A vivid, harrowing, and ultimately hopeful re-creation of Lale Sokolov's experiences as the man who tattooed the arms of thousands of prisoners with what would become one of the most potent symbols of the Holocaust, *The Tattooist of Auschwitz* is also a testament to the endurance of love and humanity under the darkest possible conditions.

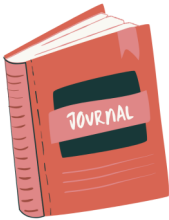
