
Adult Spelling Bee!

April Book Discussion

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On April 10 at 1:30 the book club will meet in the meeting rooms to discuss *The Maid* by Nita Prose.



Molly Gray is not like everyone else. She struggles with social skills and misreads the intentions of others. Her gran used to interpret the world for her, codifying it into simple rules that Molly could live by.

Since Gran died a few months ago, twenty-five-year-old Molly has been navigating life's complexities all by herself. No matter—she throws herself with gusto into her work as a hotel maid. Her unique character, along with her obsessive love of cleaning and proper etiquette, make her an ideal fit for the job. She delights in donning her crisp uniform each morning, stocking her cart with miniature soaps and bottles, and returning guest rooms at the Regency Grand Hotel to a state of perfection.

But Molly's orderly life is upended the day she enters the suite of the infamous and wealthy Charles Black, only to find it in a state of disarray and Mr. Black himself dead in his bed. CICOA Senior Lunch Program/Free Fruits & Veggies

Adults age 60 and up may sign up for the 11:30 daily (Monday-Friday) senior lunch at the library. The recommended donation is \$3.00 per meal. Reservations are usually made on Wednesdays. The monthly menu is printed in each library newsletter. Those who sign up are now eligible for 20 pounds of free fresh produce twice a month, with the next delivery dates on April 6 and 20. The produce box this week was awesome: fresh beets, Yukon gold potatoes, carrots, handsome green grapes, oranges, and huge apples. The only requirements are to be a

registered CICOA lunch participant (eating one meal at the library every 90 days) and to have weight and blood pressure taken and logged. The goal over the next three years is to see how weight and bp improve with the addition of more fresh produce in your diet. Karen may continue to sign people up throughout the 3-year program, with the next deadline being April 3. There's both a web interface and mobile app, and lessons can be downloaded for offline use. The interface is nice and clean, and lessons include cultural information, as well as the usual grammar tips. The individual cost is \$7.99/mo. for one language or \$17.99/mo. for access to all languages - but with a valid library card, it is **free**! Those with existing paid accounts can link

Household Hazardous Waste Collection April 29



Boone County Solid Waste Management is giving you the opportunity to responsibly and safely dispose of household hazardous waste on April 29, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Boone County Highway Garage at 1955 Indianapolis Ave. in Lebanon.

You must be a resident of Boone County, and all waste has to be residential, not business or industrial. BCSWM is asking that you stay in your vehicle during the event for health and safety.

Accepted Items:

Antifreeze, Brake Fluid, Motor Oil, Small Propane Tanks, Glues & Adhesives, Fire Extinguishers, Fluorescent Tube Lights/CFL Bulbs, Gasoline, Pool Chemicals, Oil Based Paint/Thinner/Stain, Pesticides/Herbicides/Insecticides, Household Cleaners, Aerosols, Thermometers & Thermostats, Batteries (Automobile & Rechargeable), and Tires (per Primary Residence - 4 Vehicle or Truck Tires OR 2 Tractor Tires) Electronics will also be accepted, though there will be a \$20 charge per unit for all televisions and computer monitors.

Do not bring:

share and dollar bills for the "Kitty".

latex paint, radioactive waste, explosives (ammunition, fireworks, flares, etc.), alkaline batteries, or any appliance to the drop.
