


generally two hours long, and volunteers are welcome to browse and shop while they work. Call or visit the library to sign up for a shift!

No youth programs in May to help staff prepare for the Summer Reading Program.


#### Taste of Home - May 1st

#### **May Book Discussion**

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On May 8 at 1:30 the book club will meet in room 116 to discuss *The Storied Life of A.J. Fikry* by Gabrielle Zevin.



A.J. Fikry's life is not at all what he expected it to be. His wife has died, his bookstore is experiencing the worst sales in its history, and now his prized possession, a rare collection of Poe poems, has been stolen. Slowly but surely, he is isolating himself from all the people of Alice Island. Even the books in his store have stopped holding pleasure for him. These days, A.J. can only see them as a sign of a world that is changing too rapidly.

And then a mysterious package appears at the bookstore. It's a small package, but large in weight. It's that unexpected arrival that gives A.J. Fikry the opportunity to make his life over, the ability to see everything anew. As surprising as it is moving, *The Storied Life of A.J. Fikry* is an unforgettable tale of transformation and second

chances, an irresistible affirmation of why we read, and why we love.

TPL is now offering Mango Language for the next year. Mango is a language learning software that offers 70+ languages and some ESL courses. There's both a web interface and mobile app, and lessons can be downloaded for offline use. The interface is nice and clean, and lessons include cultural information, as well as the usual grammar tips. The individual cost is \$7.99/mo. for one language or \$17.99/mo. for access to all languages - but with a valid library card, it is **free!** Those with existing paid accounts can link with

#### **CICOA News**

Adults age 60+ may sign up for the 11:30 daily (Monday-Friday) senior lunch at the library. The recommended donation is \$3.00 per meal. Those who sign up are eligible for 20 pounds of free fresh produce twice a month, with the next delivery dates on **May 4 and 18.** The only requirements are to be a registered CICOA lunch participant (eating one meal at the library every 90 days) and to have weight and blood pressure taken and logged. ### Summer Reading: Bee A Reader! June 05 - July 15

The Thorntown Public Library will begin its summer reading program for children on



Monday, June 5th. This year's theme is "Bee A Reader!" Kids can stop in the library to register and pick up a summer reading log. Parents/Caregivers are also eligible to win some great prizes just for encouraging their children to participate! Kids in the program are asked to keep track of the minutes they read and can earn incentive prizes for reading each week. A free book and the chance to enter our Money Machine will also be given to each child that reaches their summer goal. This program runs until July 15th.
