Summer Reading: Bee A Reader! June 5 - July 15

Thorntown Public Library will begin its summer reading program for children on Monday, June 5th. This year's theme is "Bee A Reader!" Kids can stop in the library to register and pick up a summer reading log. Parents/caregivers are also eligible to win some great prizes just for encouraging their children to participate! Kids in the program are asked to keep track of the minutes they read and can earn incentive prizes for reading each week. A free book and the chance to enter our Money Machine will also be given to each child that reaches their summer goal. This program runs until July 15th.



We are also excited to bring other fun entertainment experiences to the community during this time. Our kickoff program arrives on June 6th at 2:00 with the Indy Air Bears professional jump roping team. Everyone who attends will receive a free jump rope to practice their own special jumps. Other fun programs this summer will include Hedgehog Hannah, Roz Puppets, and a Foam Party! We are also bringing back our Color Run, the Carnival and a few more fun surprises! Teen Summer Programs (going into 6th grade -12th)

We have 3 events for you this summer! You need to register for 2 of them, so don't miss out!

1) June 14 (1:00) Big Games

TPL Monopol-BEE entries must be received by August 5, 2023. Drawing will be made August 7, 2023. A book may be used for multiple categories. The board may be completed by a family or group, however only one prize will be awarded.

Gourd Patch Plans

Our local gourd artists are making plans for dried, fresh, and crafted gourds to be entered into the July Boone County Fair Open Show as well as in the Indiana State Fair. On Wednesday, June 7 and 21, from 2-4:00 p.m. crafters will work on individual projects and be coached by Jim Bennett on how to make roofs using bits of pine cone on their bird feeders and houses.

Writers' Group



Cussy's not only a book woman, however, she's also the last of her kind, her skin a shade of blue unlike most anyone else. Not everyone is keen on Cussy's family or the Library Project, and a Blue is often blamed for any whiff of trouble. If Cussy wants to bring the joy of books to the hill folks, she's going to have to confront prejudice as old as the Appalachias and suspicion as deep as the holler.

Inspired by the true blue-skinned people of Kentucky and the brave and dedicated Kentucky Pack Horse library service of the 1930s, The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek is a story of raw courage, fierce strength, and one woman's belief that books can carry us anywhere—even back home.
