Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2023 summer reading program! The Youth Department had 201 children participate in the kids' reading program. We gave out tons of weekly prizes and 194 books to youth for reading during the summer. Seventy-one children got to take a turn in the money machine too. The Teen program went well this year with 56 teens participating! Lots of weekly crafts were handed out and 67 free books were given out to teens. Twenty-seven teens went into the money machine to try and catch some real cash. Raffle winners will be notified to claim their prize.

Game Night August 11


Do you like to try new games? Join us for Game Night! We'll begin the evening with a
