



The Sugar Creek Historical Society board met at the Thorntown Heritage Museum on Thursday, Jan. 18 and will again meet there at 7:00 p.m. on Feb. 15 and Mar. 21. Visitors are welcome to participate. Research is being done and plans are underway to renovate the barn on the north side of the property; this may include writing for grants to help fund the work. It is hoped that one day a large display of the history of Thorntown and Boone County basketball may be featured in the building. A summer farmers' market will be planned in conjunction with the Thorntown Park Board. Local history interviews will resume. It has been a challenging winter to keep the water dripping and the pipes from freezing in the 1865 museum building during the extremely cold weather and has been a team effort.
