Adult Spelling Bee

Five teams competed for bragging rights and glory during the March 2 Thorntown Adult Spelling Bee. Emcee Tyson Warmoth expertly called the words for Miller³, Just Wingin' It, 2020 champs Alphabet Soup, Sugar Plain Wordsmiths, and Don't Judge Us (On Our Spelling). The competition was fierce. Don't Judge Us – and their delicious cupcakes – were the clear crowd favorite. They secured 5 Style Points by winning "The Bee's Knees" award. Just Wingin' It (the rebranded "Wurd Nurds" from past competitions) were awarded 3 Style points.

Confidence was high as the spelling bee began; teams were self-assured as they submitted their spellings for *elegant*, *morale*, *angle*, *varmint*. After three rounds of competition, first-timers Miller³ were eliminated. As the bee progressed, teams stumbled on more difficult words –



millennium, sangfroid, capsaicin. Teams employed various Cheats and used their Style Points to avoid eliminations.

Just Wingin' It and Alphabet Soup went head to head in the final round. Both teams spelled *queue* correctly but got hung up on *inenarrable*. No one knew what to make of *Przewalski's horse* (to be fair, they got the "horse" part). In the end, Alphabet Soup prevailed, now two-time winners of Thorntown's Adult Spelling Bee. Congratulations to our competitors and thank you to those who cheered on our teams! The 4th Adult Spelling Bee will be held in March 2025.

Earth Day Bag Giveaway



One floor away, in the colored gallery, Cecily Patterson doesn't give a whit about the play but is grateful for a four-hour reprieve from a life that has recently gone from bad to worse. Backstage, young stagehand Jack Gibson hopes that, if he can impress the theater's managers, he'll

be offered a permanent job with the company. And on the other side of town, blacksmith Gilbert Hunt dreams of one day being able to bring his wife to the theater, but he'll have to buy her freedom first.

When the theater goes up in flames in the middle of the performance, Sally, Cecily, Jack, and Gilbert make a series of split-second decisions that will not only affect their own lives but those of countless others. And in the days following the fire, as news of the disaster spreads across the United States, the paths of these four people will become forever intertwined.
