Youth Summer Reading Recap

Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2025 summer reading program! The Youth Department had a great turn out with 307 in the kids' reading program and 84 in the teen program.

We gave out a grand total of 347 books to both kids and teens for reading during the summer. 163 kids/teens got to take a turn in the money machine too. There was a combined reading time of over 1798 hours for kids and teens!

Community Bingo!



August Book Discussion

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On August 11th at 1:30 the book club will meet in room 116 to discuss *Before We Were Yours* by Lisa Wingate.

Memphis, 1939. Twelve-year-old Rill Foss and her four younger siblings live a magical life aboard their family's Mississippi River shantyboat. But when their father must rush their mother to the hospital one stormy night, Rill is left in charge—until strangers arrive in force. Wrenched from all that is familiar and thrown into a Tennessee Children's Home Society orphanage, the Foss children are assured that they will soon be returned to their parents—but they quickly realize the dark truth. At the mercy of the facility's cruel director, Rill fights to keep her sisters and brother together in a world of danger and uncertainty.

Aiken, South Carolina, present day. Born into wealth and privilege, Avery Stafford seems to



have it all: a successful career as a federal prosecutor, a handsome fiancé, and a lavish wedding on the horizon. But when Avery returns home to help her father weather a health crisis, a chance encounter leaves her with uncomfortable questions and compels her to take a journey through her family's long-hidden history, on a path that will ultimately lead either to devastation or to redemption.

Based on one of America's most notorious real-life scandals—in which Georgia Tann, director of a Memphis-based adoption organization, kidnapped and sold poor children to wealthy families all over the country—Lisa Wingate's riveting, wrenching, and ultimately uplifting tale reminds us how, even though the paths we take can lead to many places, the heart never forgets where we belong.

Get Locked-in with the Local History Librarian

On Saturday, August 30th, the library is offering a unique research opportunity. We are opening up the Guinn Local History and Genealogy Center after hours, from 4-6 p.m. This will give you access to our microfilm, archives, family files, and more! Bring any materials you are researching, or what you are wanting to research, and any questions you may have. Printing fees will be waived during the program.

Did You Know?

The original cost to build the library in 1914 was \$7,697.00. To furnish the library, another \$1,043.63 was spent. We still have several of those pieces of furniture in the library today. In 2004 the library expanded

from 3400 to 14,100 sq. ft, which cost \$2 million.
