The Library will be closed Saturday, September 27th for carpet cleaning.


September Book Discussion

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On September 8 at 1:30 the book club will meet in room 116 to discuss A Fever in the Heartland by Timothy Egan.

The Roaring Twenties—the Jazz Age—has been characterized as a time of Gatsby frivolity. But it was also the height of the uniquely American hate group, the Ku Klux Klan. Their domain

was not the old Confederacy, but the Heartland and the West. They hated Blacks, Jews, Catholics and immigrants in equal measure, and took radical steps to keep these people from the American promise. And the man who set in motion their takeover of great swaths of America was a charismatic charlatan named D.C. Stephenson.

Stephenson was a magnetic presence whose life story changed with every telling. Within two years of his arrival in Indiana, he'd become HFARTIAN the Grand Dragon of the state and the architect of the strategy that brought the group out of the shadows - their message endorsed from the pulpits of local churches, spread at family picnics and town celebrations. Judges, prosecutors, ministers, governors and senators across the country all proudly proclaimed their membership. But at the peak of his influence, it was a seemingly powerless woman Madge Oberholtzer – who would reveal his secret cruelties, and whose deathbed testimony finally brought the Klan to their knees.

Homebound Delivery Service Available

The library offers homebound delivery for patrons who are unable to visit the library due to physical limitations or illness. This service is available to those who live in Sugar Creek, Washington, or Jefferson Townships and who have a valid Thorntown Public Library card. Homebound patrons can have up to 15 items checked out and deliveries will be made every four weeks. Library staff will work with patrons to determine which formats, authors, and genres are preferred. Patrons can also request puzzles from the library's Puzzle Swap.

Museum Plans Big for Festival

The Thorntown Heritage Museum is making big plans for the Festival of the Turning Leaves. On Friday September 26, Native Foods will be serving buffalo burgers, walking tacos, nachos and more at Tom Johnson Memorial Park from 5:30-8 p.m. A portion of the vendor's proceeds will be donated to SCHS to support the barn restoration project.



The museum is sponsoring Dave's Barrel Train rides on Saturday, Sept. 27 from 2-4 p.m. and vendors will be on the lawn both days. New this year, the American Indian Council will bring a Native American drum, singers, and dancers for a demonstration on Sat. from 2-4 p.m. The program is free, but any donations will support the Sugar Creek Historical Society and American Indian Council. The museum will be open during the festival; Fri. & Sat. 11-4 p.m. and Sun. 12-4 p.m.

Gourd Days

On Tuesdays October 7th and 21st, the project will be turkeys on straw bales using Quikwood and acrylic paints. 
CICOA Senior Lunch Program
