TPL to Receive a \$10,000 Gift in Celebration of US's 250th Anniversary



Thorntown Public Library will be one of the Carnegie Libraries across America that will each receive

a \$10,000 gift to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence through a special initiative by Carnegie Corporation of New York. Libraries may use the funds however they wish to celebrate the 250th anniversary, further their mission, and benefit their community.

Scottish immigrant Andrew Carnegie funded the construction of 1,681 free public libraries in the United States between 1886 and 1917. As part of the Carnegie Libraries 250 special initiative, his philanthropic foundation reached out to each library and established that about 1,280 still operate and acknowledge their link to Carnegie, making them eligible for the celebratory gift. Approximately 750 of them continue to use their original buildings, while others have moved to new locations.

Medicare 101 - Thursday Nov. 6th 1:00-2:00

Significant changes are coming to Medicare in 2026! Do you know what they are? Come to a **FREE** educational presentation at the library to find out, and to get the answers you need to your other Medicare questions, as well!

This program is for anyone already on Medicare, anyone approaching Medicare age (turning 65), any spouses and/or children of those on Medicare who help make these types of decisions, and anyone under 65 who is on disability and is or will be receiving Medicare benefits as well.

Information covered will include:

- How can some qualify to have a lower Part B premium, or "Extra Help" paying for their prescriptions and/or Part D premiums?
- How and when can or should I enroll in Medicare?
- What are "Special Enrollment Periods" and why do some qualify to have these all year long?
- What does Medicare cover, what doesn't it cover, and what might be your potential out-of-pocket exposure?
- What to consider when choosing Supplements, Medicare Advantage plans and Part D Prescription Coverage, as well as cost saving strategies for the years ahead.

(The Medicare Annual Enrollment Period is October 15th - December 7th, each year).






November Book Discussion

Book discussion meets on the second Monday of each month and is open to all adult readers, even those who haven't completed the reading. On November 10th at 1:30 the book club will meet in the Room 116 to discuss *The Book of Cold Cases* by Simone St. James.

In 1977, Claire Lake, Oregon, was shaken by the Lady Killer Murders: Two men, seemingly



randomly, were murdered with the same gun, with strange notes left behind. Beth Greer was the perfect suspect—a rich, eccentric twenty-three-year-old woman, seen fleeing one of the crimes. But she was acquitted, and she retreated to the isolation of her mansion.

Oregon, 2017. Shea Collins is a receptionist, but by night, she runs a true crime website, the Book of Cold Cases—a passion fueled by the attempted abduction she escaped as a child. When she meets Beth by chance, Shea asks her for an interview. To Shea's surprise, Beth says yes.

They meet regularly at Beth's mansion, though Shea is never comfortable there. Items move when she's not looking, and she could swear she's seen a girl outside the window. The allure of learning the truth about the case from the smart, charming Beth is too much to resist, but even as they grow closer, Shea senses something isn't right. Is she making friends with a manipulative murderer, or are there other dangers lurking in the darkness of the Greer house?
