In about an hour's time, your lifesaving GIFT will provide up to 3 transfusions.

#### Medicare 101 - Saturday, Oct. 11 1:30-2:30

Significant changes are coming to Medicare in 2026! Do you know what they are? Come to a **FREE** educational presentation at the library to find out, and to get the answers you need to your other Medicare questions, as well!

This program is for anyone already on Medicare, anyone approaching Medicare age (turning 65), any spouses and/or children of those on Medicare who help make these types of decisions, and anyone under 65 who is on disability and is or will be receiving Medicare benefits as well.

#### Information covered will include:

- How can some qualify to have a lower Part B premium, or "Extra Help" paying for their prescriptions and/or Part D premiums?
- How and when can or should I enroll in Medicare?
- What are "Special Enrollment Periods" and why do some qualify to have these all year long?
- What does Medicare cover, what doesn't it cover, and what might be your potential out-of-pocket exposure?
- What to consider when choosing Supplements, Medicare Advantage plans and Part D Prescription Coverage, as well as cost saving strategies for the years ahead.


(The Medicare Annual Enrollment Period is October 15th - December 7th, each year).

In Maine, a young girl named Norma grows up as the only child of an affluent family. Her father is emotionally distant, her mother frustratingly overprotective. Norma is often troubled by recurring dreams and visions that seem more like memories than imagination. As she grows older, Norma slowly comes to realize there is something her parents aren't telling her. Unwilling to abandon her intuition, she will spend decades trying to uncover this family secret.

Thorntown Heritage Museum and Thorntown Public Library are partnering with The James Hill Daughters of the American Revolution to clean and rededicate two patriot gravestones in Cox Cemetery. We will also be learning about the 20 patriots who are buried in Boone County. Volunteers are needed October 15 from 1-4 p.m. You can sign up for an hour time slot, or come for the whole time. Volunteers do not need to have prior knowledge of grave cleaning to participate. #### A Gourd-geous Autumn

Autumn is a time to admire colorful leaves, but it is also a great time to see the versatility of gourds. Small ones may be used as table decorations while large ones can be lawn decorations and bird houses. New participants are welcome to the Sugar Creek Gourd Patch. It will meet upstairs in the library Guinn Room from 2-4:00 on Tuesdays, Oct. 7, Oct. 21, Nov. 4, and Nov. 18. Making gourd turkeys with corn husk tails and seed art is on the agenda for October. In November, we'll work on wreaths. The Indiana Gourd Society's annual state show will be in the library's meeting rooms on Saturday, October 18, with no admission charge. Setup will begin at 7:00 a.m. and the show will be 10-4:00 p.m. This will be a great time to see hundreds of gourds and a wide range of decorating techniques. Both decorated and undecorated gourds may be purchased, and there will be time to make a gourd craft.
